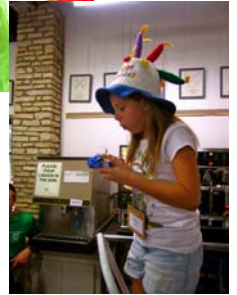




## TIPS FOR AN AWESOME ADVENTURE AT CAMP CAPERS



### Before camp begins, do...

- Check the packing list and discuss what to bring:
  - Comfortable clothes, shoes.
  - Talk about where to mark the items with their first and last name.
  - Leave favorite clothes, pillow, stuffed animals and other cherished items at home.
  - **Note our policy regarding swimsuits for junior high and high school girls. One-piece swimsuits or modest tankinis are required otherwise a t-shirt will be worn over other swimsuits.**
- Discuss the camp activities and traditions if you are familiar with them.
- Make sure your camper is up-to-date with all his/her shots.
- Mail your care packages the Thursday or Friday before camp starts, so it arrives at the beginning of camp week. No food or gum, please. You may also choose to bring them to check-in.
- Encourage your camper that he/she will have a great time.

### When checking in...

- Help your camper to settle into his/her cabin.
- Meet your camper's counselors and cabin mates.

### During camp...

- Encourage your camper to get INVOLVED in the camp traditions during meal times, chapel time, camp activities and devotion time.
- Your camper will receive a CD of pictures at the end of the session; however, you may give your camper an inexpensive camera and TAKE PICTURES.
- No news is good news!
- Keep in touch with e-mail and look for updates on our website.
- Join us for closing worship service at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday morning, if possible.



### Now the don'ts...

- No cash, cell phone, iPod, computer, or electronic games.
- No expensive jewelry or cherished items.
- Don't talk about your vacation or other activities you will be doing while your camper is at camp.

### After camp...

- Give your camper time to say good-bye to his/her friends and counselors. Remember, they were with each other for a week.
- Tell them "I can't wait to hear about your adventures!"
