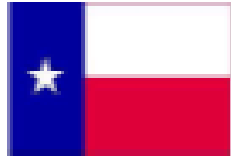

This Disaster Relief Directory is as a direct response to the tragedy of Hurricane Katrina, which sent thousands of New Orleans residents seeking shelter in San Antonio.

In the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, the volunteer response by the citizens of San Antonio was overwhelming. Yet because there was no precedent for a disaster of this size, no local directory existed to direct the outpouring of charitable and volunteer efforts to the appropriate organizations, nor to connect the evacuees with the services, supplies and other help available to them.

The faith-based community led many of San Antonio's volunteer efforts, and the Antioch Missionary Baptist Church deserves credit for producing the first booklet aimed at helping folks avail themselves of relief. Recognizing a need to expand that effort, my office worked to produce this comprehensive directory listing resources ranging from medical and legal assistance to food aid and social services. The document also guides local residents to a host of philanthropic and volunteer opportunities.

A special thanks to Emma "Phileda" Tennant, who prepared the original version of this document, which was revised in the summer of 2007 by J.C. Hernandez under the supervision of my Constituent Services Director, Dawn Ann Larios.

At its heart, this document is a testament to the generosity of San Antonio citizens who reached out to their fellow Americans in a time of great need.

Should San Antonio once again serve as a safe harbor for displaced residents from any national disaster, we hope that you will find it a vital resource linking those in need with the services and the many caring individuals committed to helping them restore their lives and their dignity.

What is public service employment and how long can it be provided? (Answer): Public service employment is temporary, subsidized work on projects that provide food, clothing, shelter and other humanitarian assistance for Hurricane disaster victims. The work may be done through public or private non-profit agencies and organizations engaged in such projects. Public service employment can be no more than six months in duration.

Can public service employment workers assist with projects operated by churches to provide humanitarian assistance such as food, shelter, clothing, etc.? (Answer): Yes.

Is there a time period (deadline) for non-profits to apply for the National Emergency Grant (NEG) temporary jobs from Alamo WorkSource? (Answer): No, there is no deadline for non-profits to apply for temporary jobs.

What types of public service employment jobs are needed? (Answer): Laborer, driver, office worker, and humanitarian/social service aides are some examples of typical job classifications. The primary purpose of an NEG is to create public service employment to assist with clean-up activities and humanitarian activities. Humanitarian assistance includes distribution of food, clothing, and other assistance to disaster victims. Humanitarian assistance may be provided through temporary workers assigned to communitybased and faith-based organizations as well as public agencies.

Are the participating employers required to have worker's compensation? The employer of record must have workers' compensation. For the Alamo Area, the employer of record will be a staffing agency contracted by Alamo WorkSource.

GUIDE FOR EVACUEES

Food Stamps and Meals

For evacuees not already receiving food stamps or WIC (Women Infants and Children), they can go to Any Office of Eligibility Services (TDHS) in Texas and apply for expedited benefits. Their benefit will be expedited regardless of previous receipt of benefits in another state, and regardless of eligibility factors.
