



## What is RSS?

RSS (Real Simple Syndication) is a format for delivering regularly changing web content. Many news related sites, weblogs and other online publishers syndicate their content as an RSS Feed to whoever chooses to subscribe.

## How does RSS work?

Simply click on the orange RSS icon and choose to subscribe to the feed. You can view it multiple ways through RSS readers.

- 1) By e-mail with Microsoft Outlook 2007 – it will automatically show all your RSS feeds in your mail folders box.
- 2) By e-mail with an Older Version of Microsoft Outlook – there is not an RSS link in your mail options. Therefore to automatically receive the feeds you will need to download an RSS reader for your e-mail.
- 2) By Internet Explorer – Open the internet, and click on your Favorites (the orange star icon) and select “Feeds” to read all the latest updates.

## What is a RSS Reader?

Feed Reader or News Aggregator software allows you to grab the RSS feeds from various sites and display them for you to read and use.

A [variety of RSS Readers](#) are available for different platforms. Some popular feed readers include [Amphetadesk](#) (Windows, Linux, Mac), [FeedReader](#) (Windows), and [NewsGator](#) (Windows - integrates with Outlook). There are also a number of web-based feed readers available. [My Yahoo](#), [Bloglines](#), and [Google Reader](#) are popular web-based feed readers.
